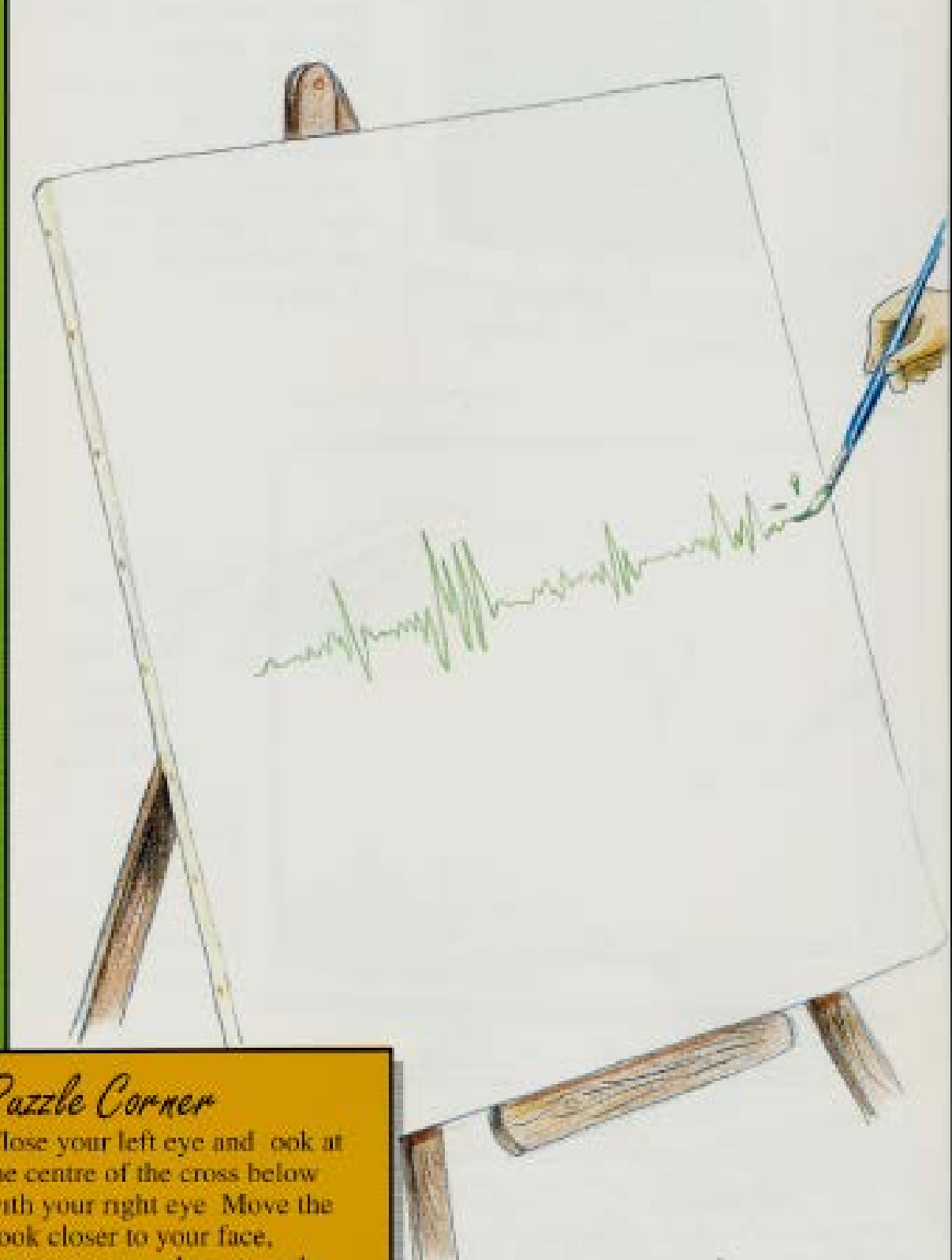
Joke Corner

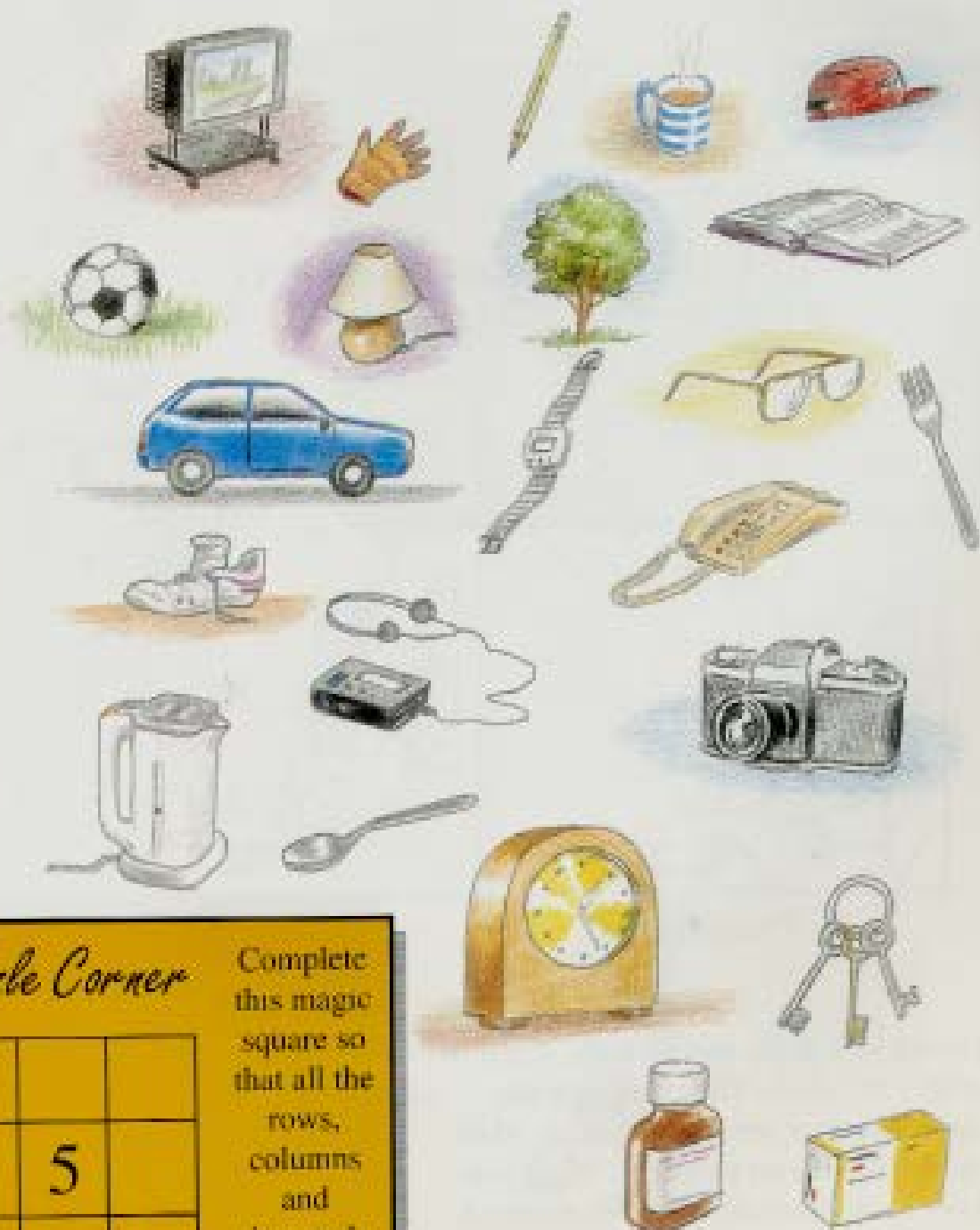

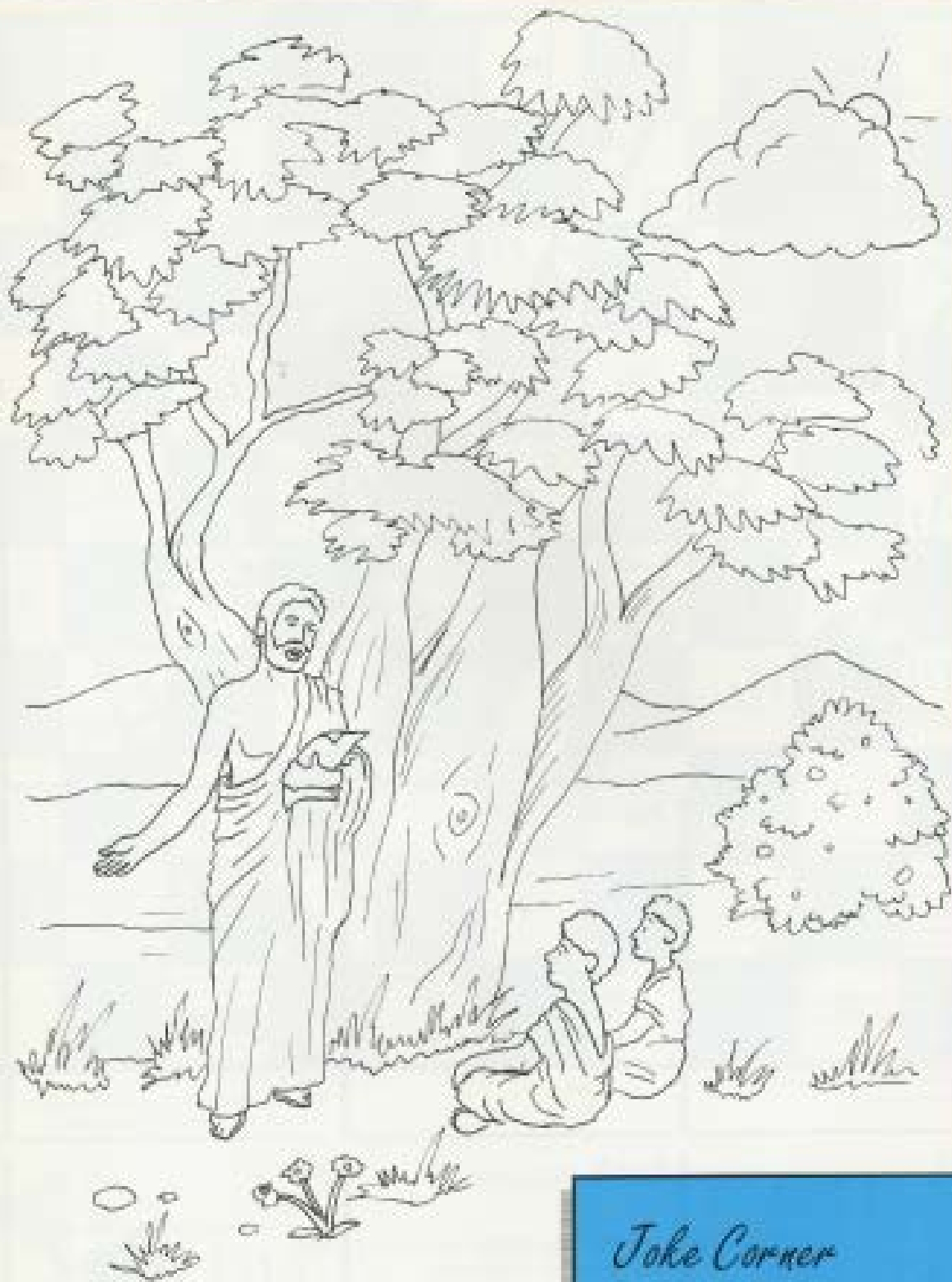
